2025 Teen Business Plan Competition

In a whirlwind of innovation and determination, this year's Business Plan Competition saw an incredible turnout at California State University, Dominguez Hills. 52 business teams comprised of more than 200 teens, from 18 high schools, clubs, and after-school programs from across 6 states participated in the event, with several joining in via Zoom. Amidst fierce competition, 11 exceptional teams emerged victorious, walking away with a total of \$7,250 in college scholarships. We're still celebrating the

achievements of each of our teams, and acknowledge their hard work, creativity, and dedication to completing the requirements to join the competition, and pitching their start-up to a panel of judges. The 2025 Highlights Newsletter celebrates the incredible achievements of all of our young entrepreneurs, along with this year's winning teams.

Project ECHO's capstone event was hosted at California State University, Dominguez Hills, College of Business Administration and Public Policy, in Carson, CA. Around 200 teens participated, 81 judges evaluated written business plans, 25 judges assessed presentations, and hundreds of teachers, parents, friends, volunteers, and supporters cheered the teens on!

Multiple teams from across the country, including those from California, Maryland, Virginia, New Jersey, New York, and Massachusetts, joined the 2025 Business Plan Competition live via Zoom.

"Recognizing the growth of Project ECHO's entrepreneurship programs beyond our Southern California roots has been an amazing accomplishment," says Diane Quast, Executive Director.

This year's third-place winner in the Social Enterprise category, ReTech For Kids, is from Virginia. Judges were impressed with their written business plan, pitch, and participation in the judges' Q&A. CSUDH students serving as Room Managers facilitated Zoom presentations in all of the competition classrooms.

This victory underscores the competition's growing impact, in addition to celebrating the entrepreneurial spirit thriving across different regions.

Chip Goodman Entrepreneurial Teacher of the Year Award


